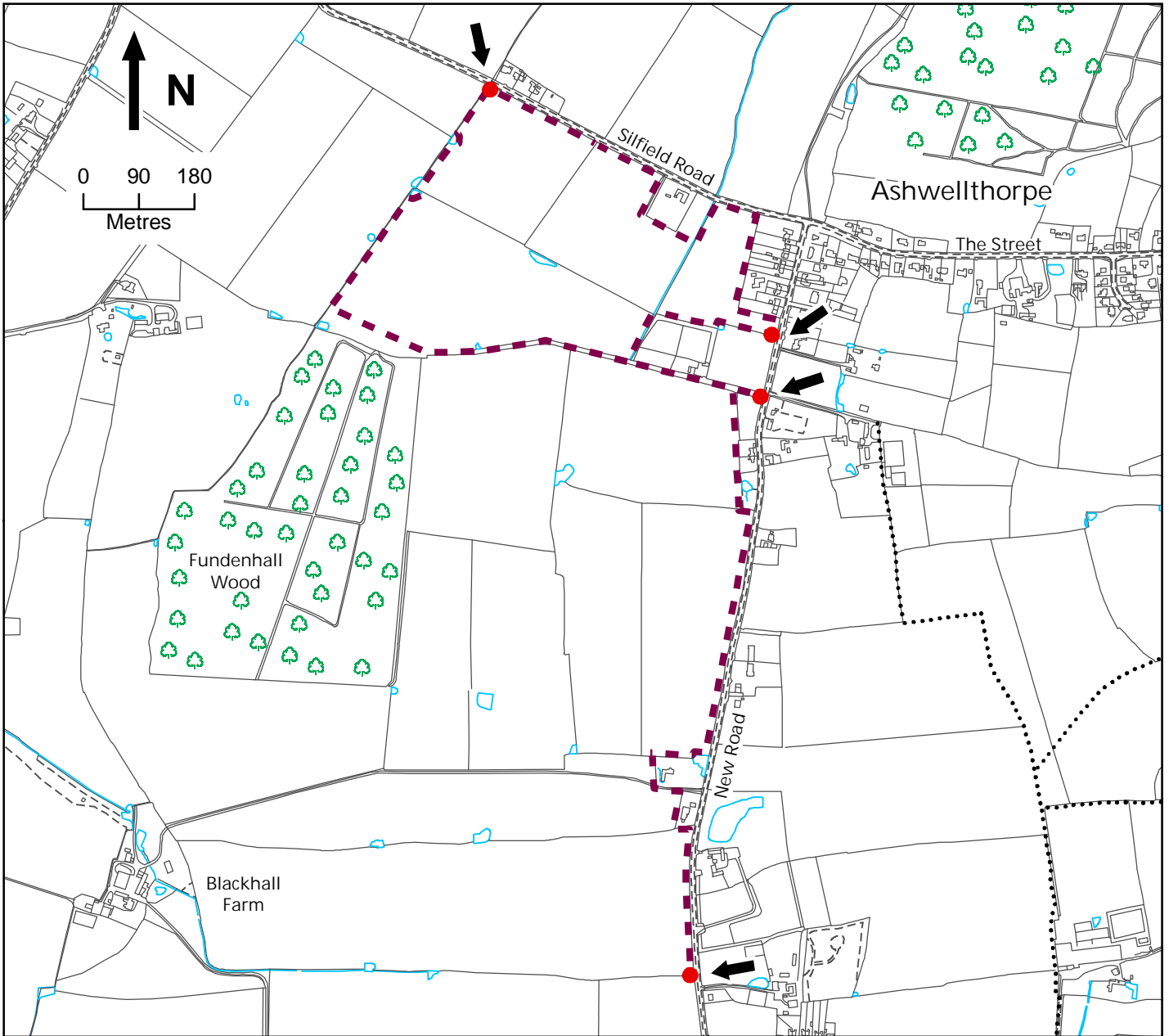


# PERMISSIVE ACCESS

The permissive bridleways at Black Hall Farm offer a safe, off road opportunity for riders and also walkers to enjoy the landscape of this South Norfolk Farm. In summer many of the field margins are full of wildflowers and swallows, swifts and house martins swoop overhead as they hunt for their insect prey. These paths are part of a wider farmland conservation scheme which also includes re-creation of an ancient pasture and restoration of several farm ponds.
